	Objective	Read Aloud	Activity
Day 1	Children will learn how squirrels gather food in the fall to prepare for winter.	<b>Book:</b> "The Busy Little Squirrel" by Nancy Tafuri <b>Discussion:</b> Why the squirrel in the story was busy. How squirrels gather food to prepare for winter.	Nut Hunt Hide the printed nuts around the room and have children pretend to be squirrels, gathering as many nuts as they can. Materials: Activity 1 Printables
Day 2	Children will discover how owls hunt at night during the fall season.	<b>Book:</b> "Owl Babies" by Martin Waddell <b>Discussion:</b> How the owl babies might have felt when their mother was away. Why owls hunt at night in the fall.	Owl Craft Collect autumn leaves. Children will glue the leaves onto the owl for feathers, add googly eyes. Materials: Owl Craft printable, leaves, large googly eyes, glue, scissors.
Day 3	Children will understand h o w h e d g e h o g s prepare to hibernate during the fall.	<b>Book:</b> "The Very Helpful Hedgehog" by Rosie Wellesley <b>Discussion:</b> What the hedgehog learned in the story. Why hedgehogs curl up when scared, and how they prepare for winter.	Hedgehog Clothes Pin Craft Children will paint the hedgehog and clip clothes pins along the back to create spikes. Materials: Hedgehog Printable, paint, paintbrushes, wooden clothes pins
Day 4	Children will explore how deer gather food and prepare for winter in the fall.	<b>Book:</b> "Little Deer Lost" by Janet Bingham <b>Discussion:</b> How the little deer found its way back. Where deer live, what they eat in the fall, how they get ready for winter.	<b>Deer Antler Headband Craft</b> Children will cut and color the antler templates, and attach the antlers to a brown paper strip to create a headband. <b>Materials:</b> Antler Printable, crayons, fall-colored paper scraps
Day 5	Children will learn how bears prepare for hibernation during the fall.	<b>Book:</b> "Bear Snores On" by Karma Wilson <b>Discussion:</b> Why bear slept though the party. How bears eat a lot in the fall to prepare for hibernation.	<b>Bear Cave Creation</b> Set up a "bear cave" using blankets and chairs, let children pretend to be bears gathering pretend food. <b>Materials:</b> Printable bear cave sign, printable or plastic toy food

# Fall Animals

### Day 1: Squirrels

Children will learn how squirrels gather food in the fall to prepare for winter.

### Introduction

"Today, we're going to learn about squirrels! In the fall, squirrels are very busy gathering food for the winter. Have you ever seen a squirrel running around with a nut? Let's find out what they do!"

## Song

The squirrel in the tree goes run, run, run, Run, run, run, run, run, run, The squirrel in the tree goes run, run, run, All through the fall!

Action & Props: Children can hold the props while they pretend to run like squirrels.

### **Read Aloud & Discussion**

Book: "The Busy Little Squirrel" by Nancy Tafuri

**Before Reading:** "This book is all about a little squirrel that is too busy to stop and play. Let's see what keeps him so busy in the fall!"

After Reading: "Why was the squirrel so busy? What do you think the squirrel does with all the food it gathers?" Discuss how squirrels prepare for the winter.







Nut Hunt

Materials: Activity 1 Printables

Activity: Hide the printed nuts around the room and have children pretend to be squirrels, gathering as many nuts as they can. Discuss how squirrels collect and hide food for winter. (Squirrels collect nuts, seeds, and other food in the fall to store for winter when food is scarce. They hide it in holes, tree bark, or under leaves, a process called "caching." With their great memory, they usually find their food in winter, but sometimes they forget, and those hidden seeds can grow into new plants. This helps them survive through the cold months.)

**Extension:** Let children count their nuts at the end and sort them by size or color.








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














## Squirrels

Squirrels spend the fall collecting nuts, seeds, and acorns to store for winter when it's harder to find food. They hide their food in the ground, under leaves, or in trees. They can remember where most of their food is hidden, but sometimes they forget, and the seeds grow into new plants. Their big, bushy tails help them balance and keep warm.

If sorting by size and color, print the next few of sorting mats. The sorting mats can be used to sort other items from your classroom.





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


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## Find the Acorns Maze
