


Read Aloud & Discussion

Book: "Llama Llama Holiday Drama" by Anna Dewdney

Before Reading: "Have you ever felt really excited about Christmas? Or maybe a little tired from all the activity? Let's see how Llama Llama handles holiday stress."

After Reading: "How did Llama Llama feel during the holidays? What made him feel better? What can we do if we ever feel overwhelmed?"



Activity

Christmas Keepsake Ornament

Materials: Cardstock with printed ornament template; markers; sequins, glitter, stickers, and other decorations; glue; hole punch; Christmas ribbon; scissors; permanent markers; laminator, optional

Instructions: Color and decorate the printed ornament with markers, glitter, sequins, and stickers. Write the child's name and the year on the ornament using a permanent marker. Laminate the ornament for durability if desired. Measure the child's height with Christmas ribbon, then cut the ribbon to match their height. Punch a hole at the top of the ornament and tie the ribbon through it.

Extension: Introduce basic measurement concepts by having children compare their ribbons with their classmates'. Discuss who is taller or shorter and explore how they'll grow over time.

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Circle Time Props and Actions: Day 1

Print, laminate and cut out. If using on a felt board, attach velcro to the back of each piece. If using on a white board, attach magnetic strips to the back of each piece.

Print multiple copies and attach to craft sticks for children to use (optional).



Actions:

- **1. O Christmas tree, O Christmas tree:** Hold your hands in front of you and shape them into a triangle, representing the shape of a Christmas tree. Alternatively, use both arms to create a triangle above your head and sway gently from side to side.
- **2. How lovely are your branches:** Gently wave your hands or arms like tree branches swaying in the wind. You can also pretend to decorate the tree by reaching out and mimicking placing ornaments on the "branches."
- **3. Not only green in summer's heat, But also winter's snow and sleet:** Place your arms out in front of you, swaying as if the branches are moving in the wind. Then, gesture like you're sprinkling snow by fluttering your fingers in the air, creating a snowing effect.
- **4.** O Christmas tree, O Christmas tree, How lovely are your branches: Repeat the first movement of creating a triangle shape with your arms or holding them wide to represent the tree again, swaying slightly.







Day 1 Activity: Paper Loops Christmas Tree

Materials:

- Template: Background, printed on blue cardstock
- Template: Christmas tree loops, printed on green paper
- Template: Star, printed on yellow paper
- Template: Christmas tree trunk, printed on brown paper
- Scissors
- Glue
- Glitter, sequins, slickers, small pom-poms

Instructions:

- 1. Cut out 15 strips from the green paper. Curl each strip into a loop and glue the ends together. The glued area should be about 1 inch. Do this for all the strips.
- 2. Glue the brown strip of paper to make the tree trunk.
- 3. Starting at the bottom of the background template, glue the loops in a row. Use the lines as a guide. Gradually add more loops as you build the tree up in layers, forming a pyramid.
- 4. Glue the yellow star at the top of the tree.
- 5. Decorate the tree with glitter, sequins, slickers or small pom-poms.

Extension Idea:

After completing the tree, have children share a story about how they would decorate a Christmas tree at home or in a classroom. This encourages language development and imaginative thinking.




