



Day 2: Polar Bears

Children will learn about polar bears and their adaptations for living in the Arctic.

Introduction

"Good morning, friends! Have you ever seen a big, white bear? Today, we're going to learn about polar bears and how they stay warm in the icy Arctic!" Explain that Polar bears have thick fur and fat to stay warm and are great swimmers.

Song

"Arctic Animals" (Tune: "Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star") Verse 2

Prop: Polar Bear

Action: 1. Stretch arms wide to show "big."

- 2. Pretend to throw snowballs.
- 3. Wave hand in front of you to mimic waves in the ocean.
- 4. Pretend to sleep by resting your head on your hands.


Read Aloud & Discussion

Book: "Polar Bear Night" by Lauren Thompson

Before Reading: "Have you ever gone outside at night and noticed how quiet it is? In this story, a little polar bear takes a walk through the snowy Arctic under the stars. Let's see what happens."

After Reading: "How did the polar bear feel as it wandered through the quiet night? What beautiful things did it see in the sky? What did this story teach us about the calm and peaceful Arctic night?"





Activity

Polar Bear Arctic Scene Craft

Materials: Printable polar bear silhouette, colored tissue paper squares (shades of blue, pink, purple), white cardstock, glue, scissors, cotton balls for snow effect or glitter for a frosty touch (optional).

Instructions: Children will create an Arctic background by gluing colored tissue paper squares onto a piece of cardstock. Next, they will cut out a polar bear silhouette and glue it on top of their tissue paper collage.

Extension: Display the finished crafts and discuss features of the Arctic, such as icebergs, snow, and how animals like polar bears adapt to the cold.

The Arctic: A Magical, Icy World

The Arctic is a very cold place at the top of the Earth! It's covered in snow and ice for most of the year, but during the summer, some ice melts, and plants can grow on the land.



Extreme Weather

The Arctic is known for its extreme weather. Winters are incredibly cold, and the sun doesn't come up for weeks or even months, creating long, dark nights. In summer, the sun stays in the sky all day and night, making it bright and sunny even at midnight!



Ice and Snow Everywhere

In the Arctic, there is ice and snow all around! The Arctic Ocean is covered with ice that floats on the water. The ground is always frozen, even under the plants! This frozen ground is called permafrost, and it stays cold all year long.



What Grows in the Arctic?

Even though it's so cold, tough plants like moss, lichens, and tiny shrubs grow in the Arctic. These plants are an important food source for many Arctic animals.



Amazing Lights in the Sky!

The Arctic is one of the best places to see the Northern Lights! These magical lights glow and dance in the sky in shades of green, purple, and pink.




The Arctic Ocean

Most of the Arctic is covered by ocean, surrounded by icy land. The chilly waters are home to fish, seals, and other sea creatures that can survive in the cold.



Why is the Arctic Special?

The Arctic helps keep the Earth cool by reflecting sunlight with its ice. It's a unique and important place, home to amazing animals, plants, and people who thrive in its icy beauty.



Polar Bear – The Arctic Hunter


Polar bears are built for the cold! They have thick, white fur to blend in with the snow and a layer of fat, called blubber, to stay warm. They are excellent swimmers and can travel long distances to find food like seals. Polar bears have large paws that help them walk on ice and paddle in water. These powerful predators are at the top of the Arctic food chain.

Matching Arctic Animal Shadows


Cut out the pictures and paste them on top of their matching shadows.






Day 2 Activity: Polar Bear Silhouette
