





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Introduction

Teaching young children about dental health is a fun and essential way to build lifelong habits for healthy teeth and gums. This week-long circle time plan is designed to engage preschoolers in interactive, hands-on activities that teach them about the importance of brushing, flossing, healthy food choices, and regular visits to the dentist. With creative crafts, sensory bins, role-playing, and storytime, children will explore dental hygiene in a playful and meaningful way. Each day features a unique theme with age-appropriate activities that combine literacy, fine motor skills, and health education, making learning about dental health both enjoyable and impactful!

What's Included:

1. Detailed Circle Time plans

Each day of the week is planned with a structured circle time agenda that includes:

- Introduction: A brief and captivating introduction to the daily theme, setting the stage for the day's activities.

Day 2	Foods and Drinks for Healthy Teeth Children will differentiate between foods and drinks that are healthy or harmful for their teeth and recognize the benefits of drinking water for oral health.	Book: "Sugarbug Doug: All About Cavities, Plaque, and Teeth" by Dr. Ben Magleby Discussion: What happened to Sugarbug Doug. Foods and drinks help our teeth stay healthy. Dentist Role-Play Children will take turns playing dentist, patient, and assistant in a pretend office. Materials: Dentist tools, chair, stuffed animals or dolls, masks, gloves.
Day 5	Losing a Tooth and the Tooth Fairy Children will explore the process of losing baby teeth and the transition to adult teeth, learn about the Tooth Fairy and related cultural traditions.	Book: "Llama, Llama Loose Tooth Drama" by Anna Dewdney Discussion: How Llama Llama felt about losing his tooth. What happens after a tooth falls out: visit from the tooth fairy.	Tooth Color Matching Sensory Bin Children will match colored tooth cutouts in a sensory bin. Materials: Sensory bin (filled with rice or cotton balls), colored tooth cutouts, matching cards, scoops.

Day 3: How to Brush and Floss

Children will learn the proper techniques for brushing and flossing their teeth, understand the importance of doing so twice a day, and identify the tools used for dental care.

Introduction

Yesterday, we learned about the foods that are good and bad for our teeth. Today, we're going to talk about how to take care of our teeth by brushing and flossing. How many times a day do you think we should brush our teeth? Let's find out the best way to keep our teeth clean and healthy!

Song


"Brush and Floss" (Tune: "This is the Way")

Prop: Toothbrush and yarn for dental floss

Actions:

Verse 1: Using the toothbrush, pretend to brush teeth with big circular motions as you sing.

Verse 2: Wrap the floss (yarn) around fingers and demonstrate gentle back-and-forth flossing motions between imaginary teeth.





Read Aloud & Discussion

Book: "Brush Your Teeth Please" by Leslie McGuire (Pop-up book)

Before Reading: "How do you brush your teeth? This book is going to show us how to brush our teeth the right way!"

After Reading: "How did the characters in the story brush their teeth? Did they remember to brush the tops, backs, and fronts? Why is it important to brush your teeth for two minutes? What happens if we don't brush all parts of our teeth? Who can show me how you would brush your teeth at home?"

Activity

Brush and Floss Practice

Materials: Laminated printable of teeth, dry erase marker, toothbrush, Duplo blocks, pieces of yarn (around 12–18 inches long)

Instructions: Brushing: Draw "plaque" on the laminated teeth with a dry erase marker. Use a toothbrush to remove the marks with circular motions. Flossing: Press play dough between Duplo studs to mimic food. Use yarn to floss between the studs and remove the play dough.

Extension: Discuss how important it is to brush for two minutes twice a day, especially after meals. Explain why flossing is essential to clean between teeth where toothbrushes can't reach.




Floss Your Teeth

Break off about 18 inches of floss.

Wrap most of the floss around your middle fingers, leaving 2 inches to work with.




3

Gently slide the floss between your teeth to make a "C" shape.




4

Slide the floss up and down the side of each tooth.

Use a clean section of floss for each tooth.



Day 2 Additional Activity: Egg in Soda Experiment

Objective: Children will learn why brushing their teeth is essential, especially after eating or drinking sugary treats. Using eggs to represent tooth enamel, the class will see firsthand how sugary drinks can stain and damage teeth over time.



Materials:

- 2 hard-boiled eggs with white shells
- 2 clear cups (glass or plastic)
- Dark soda (e.g., cola or root beer)
- Water
- Toothbrush
- Toothpaste
- Printable science experiment worksheet (optional)



Instructions:

- 1. **Explain the Concept:** Begin by discussing with the class how our teeth are protected by a strong layer called enamel. Explain that the eggshell will represent enamel in this experiment.
- 2. Introduce the Experiment: Tell the class that the experiment will show what happens to teeth when sugary drinks are left on them for too long.
- 3. **Set Up:** Pour soda into one cup and water into the other. Place one hard-boiled egg in the soda and the other in the water.
- 4. Observation: Leave the eggs in their respective cups overnight.
- 5. **The Next Day:** Remove both eggs and observe the changes. The egg in the soda will be stained, showing the impact of sugar and dark drinks on teeth. The egg in water will remain unchanged, representing how water is safe for teeth.
- **6. Brushing Demonstration:** Use a toothbrush and toothpaste to scrub the sodastained egg. Let the class observe how brushing can help clean teeth and remove surface stains, but also emphasize the importance of brushing immediately to prevent deeper damage.


Discussion Questions:

- What do you think caused the egg in the soda to stain?
- How did brushing help the stained egg?
- Why is it important to drink water and brush your teeth after sugary drinks?
- Can you think of other things we can do to keep our teeth healthy?
- 1. **Extension Idea:** Have children fill out the science experiment worksheet.






Egg in Soda Results

Color the picture of the egg to show how the egg in soda looked after it was taken out of the cup.






