# Introduction

The Earth Day Preschool Circle Time Plan is designed to introduce young learners to the beauty and importance of caring for our planet. Over five engaging days, children will explore Earth-friendly themes through hands-on crafts, meaningful discussions, songs, and stories that celebrate nature and promote environmental responsibility. Each day features a themed read-aloud paired with an activity that encourages children to take simple, relatable actions like recycling, conserving water, and helping animals. Through painting, sorting, planting, and creative expression, children will build early awareness of how their actions impact the Earth while developing fine motor skills, language, and a love for nature. This interactive, play-based plan helps preschoolers understand that even small helpers can make a big difference in keeping our world clean, green, and full of life.

#### What's Included:

#### 1. Detailed Circle Time plans

Each day of the week is planned with a structured circle time agenda that includes:

- Introduction: A brief and captivating introduction to the daily theme, setting the stage for the day's activities.
- Song: A fun and educational song related to the daily theme, designed to engage children and reinforce learning through music and movement.
- Read aloud and discussion: A carefully selected picture book paired with thoughtprovoking discussion questions to enhance comprehension and encourage interaction.

Day 3	Plants and Gardening Children will learn that plants grow from seeds and that caring for plants is one way to help the Earth (e.g., by giving oxygen and beauty). They will practice planting and understand the basics of gardening.	Book: "Lola Plants a Garden" by Anna McQuinn  Discussion: How Lola grows her garden and the steps needed to help seeds grow.	Flower Garden Craft Children cut out flowers, parts then glue them onto paper to create their own garden collage.  Materials: Flower Garden printable, glue, scissors, white cardstock, markers.
Day 4	Animals and Nature Children will learn that all animals (including people) share the Earth and depend on nature (trees, water, air). They will recognize simple ways to protect wildlife and habitats.	Book: "The Busy Tree" by Jennifer Ward  Discussion: How trees help animals by giving them food, shelter, and a safe home.	My Busy Tree Craft Children tear green paper for leaves, color animal cutouts, and glue them onto a tree page. Materials: My Busy Tree printable, green construction paper, scissors, crayons, glue.
Day 5	Taking Action – Clean Water and Earth Care Children will learn practical Earth-friendly actions they can take in daily life, such as conserving water and cleaning up litter. They will understand that small actions by everyone help protect the planet.	Book: "10 Things I Can Do to Help My World" by Melanie Walsh  Discussion: Simple daily actions kids can do to help the Earth, like saving water and turning off lights.	I Can Help the Earth Activity Children draw and decorate a picture of one way they can help the Earth. Materials: I Can Help the Earth printable, crayons.

### Day 1: Our Earth and Earth Day

Children will learn that Earth is our home, Earth Day is on April 22, and we can celebrate by caring for the planet. They will understand simple ways to show kindness to Earth.

#### Introduction

Hold up a globe or Earth picture. "Today we're going to talk about something very special — the place where we all live. It's not just our house or city — it's the Earth! Earth is our big, beautiful home with oceans, trees, animals, and people. And did you know that Earth has a holiday? It's called Earth Day, and it happens every year on April 22nd. Earth Day is when we show the planet how much we love it by keeping it clean and healthy."

#### Song

"Earth is Special" (Tune: "Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star")

**Props:** trash bag, plant, light switch, faucet, bird seed.

Actions: Line 1: Thumbs up. Line 2: Make a roof shape over your head. Line 3: Pretend to pick up trash, then dig and plant. Line 4: Pretend to flip a switch and twist a faucet. Line 5: Pretend to toss birdseed. Line 6: Wave both hands out wide (like spreading help all around).




#### **Read Aloud & Discussion**

Book: "Earth Day, Birthday!" by Maureen Wright

**Before Reading:** "Have you heard of Earth Day? What kinds of things do you think we could do to help the Earth? What do we mean by 'taking care of the Earth'?"

After Reading: "What was Monkey upset about? How did the other animals want to celebrate? What did Monkey learn at the end? What are some things we heard about helping the Earth (like planting, recycling, picking up trash)?" Encourage children to recall the actions (e.g., using a cloth bag, planting trees) from the story.



### Activity

#### **Paper Plate Earth Craft**

**Materials:** Paper Plate Earth Craft printables (3 pages), paper plates, blue and green paint, sponges or brushes, scissors, glue.

**Activity:** Give each child a paper plate. Invite them to sponge-paint or finger-paint their plate with blue and green to resemble Earth. Once dry, have children glue a red heart to the center. Add a "Happy Earth Day!" label below or above the heart.

**Extension:** Create a "Hanging Earth Gallery" by stringing yarn across your circle time area or hallway. Tie each Earth to the line to decorate the space with the children's artwork. While hanging them, invite each child to share one way they can help the Earth (e.g., "I can recycle" or "I can plant flowers") and write their ideas on the back of their plate.


Print, laminate and cut out the cards. These will get sorted to either the recycling bin or garbage bin mats.



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
