Introduction

Day 1: What Are Plants?

Children will explore what a plant is, where we find them, and what grows in a garden. They'll begin to understand that gardens are special places for growing food and flowers.

Introduction

Show children a real plant or flower. "Today we're talking about something special — plants! Plants are all around us: in gardens, parks, and even our homes. They grow from tiny seeds and need sunlight, water, and soil to grow. Can you name something that grows in a garden? Let's look at this plant together and explore what makes it so amazing!"

Song

"Gardener Plants the Seeds" (Tune: "Farmer in the Dell")

Props: pea seed packet, sun, rain, sprout.

Actions:

Verse 1: Pretend to dig and plant seeds.

Verse 2: Make a big circle with arms to mimic the sun.

Verse 3: Flutter fingers down like raindrops.

Verse 4: Slowly stand up and stretch arms up tall like growing plants.




Read Aloud & Discussion

Book: "My Garden" by Kevin Henkes

Before Reading: "If you could grow anything in a garden, what would you plant? Would it be flowers, food... or maybe something silly like chocolate?"

After Reading: Talk about the difference between the girl's imaginary garden and real gardens. Ask: "What were some of the silly things the girl wanted to grow? Do real flowers change colors or grow lollipops? What's the difference between her dream garden and a real one?" Compare fantasy vs. reality and spark excitement for learning how real gardens work this week.



Activity

Plant Sorting Activity

Materials: Plant or Not a Plant printables (5 pages).

Activity: Tell the class they'll help sort pictures into two groups: plants and not plants. Hold up each picture and ask: "What is this? Does it grow in the ground? Is it a plant?" Invite a child to place the picture under the correct heading. Use simple prompts: "Plants grow in soil and need sun and water. If it moves or has legs, it's probably not a plant." Continue until all pictures are sorted.

Extension: Let children gently explore a real plant. Encourage them to touch the leaves and soil, smell the flower, talk about what they notice (color, texture, parts). Use words like stem, leaf, flower, and roots as they explore.





Circle Time Props

NO PROPS FOR THIS SONG

Actions:

Flower: Point to your head (flower grows at the top).

Stem: Place both hands on your torso (stem is the main part of the plant).

Leaves: Stretch your arms out wide (like the leaves spreading out).

Roots: Stomp your feet (roots are deep in the soil).

Sun: Circle arms above your head like the sun shining.

Rain: Flutter fingers down like raindrops falling.

Fresh Air: Take a deep breath and puff out your chest.


