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# Introduction

This week's preschool circle time plan is all about celebrating Mother's Day—a time for children to recognize and appreciate the love, care, and special moments they share with their moms (or mother figures). Throughout the week, children will engage in stories, discussions, and hands-on crafts that help them reflect on what makes their mom special and how they can show love in return.

Each day includes purposeful, age-appropriate activities that build toward a special celebration at the end of the week. On Day 5, children will recite a poem they have learned and practiced, using simple hand movements. Teachers are encouraged to organise a short and meaningful Mother's Day celebration where children can present their poem, share their handmade gifts, and enjoy a joyful moment with their families.

### What's Included:

### 1. Detailed Circle Time plans

Each day of the week is planned with a structured circle time agenda that includes:

- Introduction: A brief and captivating introduction to the daily theme, setting the stage for the day's activities.
- Song: A fun and educational song related to the daily theme, designed to engage children and reinforce learning through music and movement.
- Read aloud and discussion: A carefully selected picture book paired with thoughtprovoking discussion questions to enhance comprehension and encourage interaction.
- Activities: Creative and hands-on activities that complement the day's theme, fostering gross and fine motor skills, creativity, and critical thinking.

### 2. Posters and props

Enhance Circle Time with visual and tactile aids:

- *Posters*: Vibrant posters featuring the lyrics and illustrations for each daily song, making it easy for children to follow along and participate. The product also includes non-fiction posters, providing educational content alongside the fun.
- *Props:* Printable props related to each song and theme help bring the songs and stories to life and engage children in interactive play.

## Day 1: What is Mother's Day?

Children will learn about Mother's Day, its meaning, and how we celebrate it. They will understand that Mother's Day is a special time to appreciate and show love to mothers.

### Introduction

"Today, we're going to talk about Mother's Day! Can anyone tell me what makes Mother's Day so special? That's right, it's a day to show our love to our moms! What are some ways we can make our moms feel special on this day? Let's learn about why Mother's Day is so important and how we can celebrate it!"

## Song

"My Mom's Special Touch" poem

Actions:

Lines 1&2: Open arms wide like sunshine, smile big.

Lines 3&4: Cross arms over chest like a hug, then pretend to tuck a blanket under your chin. Lines 5&6: Start low and slowly reach up like a flower growing; then raise fists and say "yay!" Lines 7&8: Tap finger gently on a pretend spot for boo-boo, then wipe pretend tears from face.

Lines 9&10: Make a heart with hands, then point to self and out.

Lines 11&12: Stretch arms out wide, then cross fingers like a promise.

## **Read Aloud & Discussion**

Book: "The Night Before Mother's Day" by Natasha Wing

**Before Reading:** "What do you think would make your mom feel special on Mother's Day? Today, we're going to read a story about a family getting ready to surprise their mom. Let's see what fun ideas they have!"

After Reading: "Wasn't that a fun story? What are some of the things the family did to get ready for Mother's Day? Do you think you would want to do the same things for your mom? What was your favorite part of the story? How do you think we can make our moms feel special on Mother's Day? Let's think about what we can do to show them how much we love them!"


# Activity

### Mother's Day Suncatcher Card - Part 1


**Materials:** I Love You to Pieces card template printed onto cardstock, laminator and pouches, tissue paper and/or cellophane, scissors, single hole punch, ribbon, clear tape, crayons or markers.

Activity: Give each child a folded cardstock template. Show how to cut out the large heart carefully and help as needed. Have children fill a laminating pouch with tissue paper or cellophane. Laminate and cool under a heavy book. Punch a hole at the top and tie a ribbon through. Cut a piece of the laminated sheet large enough to cover the heart opening. Lightly tape the suncatcher behind the heart so it can be removed later. Children decorate the front of their card with crayons, stickers, or foam shapes. Encourage them to use their mom's favorite colors or draw small hearts and flowers.





# Day 1 Activity: Mother's Day Card

### Mother's Day Suncatcher Card – Full Instructions

Materials:

- Cardstock
- "I  $\bigcirc$  YOU TO PIECES" printable template
- tissue paper and/or cellophane
- laminator and laminating pouches
- scissors
- single hole punch
- ribbon
- cleartape
- crayons and markers
- optional stickers or foam shapes

### Step 1: Fold and Prepare the Card

Give each child a piece of cardstock folded in half to make a portrait-style card. Point to the printed large heart shape. Explain that this will become the window for their colorful heart.

### Step 2: Cut Out the Heart

Model how to carefully cut around the heart shape. Tip: start by gently poking a small hole in the center to insert scissors. Help younger children as needed.

### Step 3: Create the Suncatcher

Give each child a laminating pouch. Invite them to fill it with small pieces of colored tissue paper or cellophane. Explain that they should spread the colors out so light can shine through.

### Step 4: Laminate and Cool

Laminate the filled pouch. After laminating, place the warm pouch under a heavy book to cool flat. This keeps it smooth and easy to work with later.

### Step 5: Decorate the Front of the Card

Invite children to color the words "I  $\heartsuit$  YOU TO PIECES" and decorate around the heart. Offer crayons, markers, stickers, or foam shapes. Encourage them to use their mom's favorite colors or draw little hearts and flowers.

### Step 6: Punch a Hole and Add Ribbon

After cooling, punch a hole near the top center of the laminated suncatcher. Help children tie a piece of ribbon through the hole.

### Step 7: Attach the Suncatcher


Cut a piece of the laminated sheet slightly larger than the heart opening. Lightly tape it behind the heart cutout so it stays in place but can be removed later.

### Step 8: Draw a Picture and Write a Matching Sentence

On the following day, children complete their card by drawing a picture of something their mom is especially good at or something they love doing together. Under the drawing, write a sentence based on the child's dictation to capture their special thought or memory.
