## Pond Animals PRESCHOOL CIRCLE TIME

5 lesson plans | songs | posters | activities | printables

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### Introduction

Welcome to a week of hands-on exploration and discovery as we dive into the world of ponds! This Pond Preschool Circle Time Plan is designed to spark curiosity and wonder through interactive lessons, engaging stories, and creative play. Children will explore the animals, plants, and life cycles that make ponds so special, while building foundational skills in language, science, and movement. Through sensory-rich activities and thoughtful discussions, your preschoolers will connect with nature and deepen their understanding of pond life in fun and meaningful ways.

#### What's Included:

#### 1. Detailed Circle Time plans

Each day of the week is planned with a structured circle time agenda that includes:

- Introduction: A brief and captivating introduction to the daily theme, setting the stage for the day's activities.
- Song: A fun and educational song related to the daily theme, designed to engage children and reinforce learning through music and movement.
- Read aloud and discussion: A carefully selected picture book paired with thoughtprovoking discussion questions to enhance comprehension and encourage interaction.
- Activities: Creative and hands-on activities that complement the day's theme, fostering gross and fine motor skills, creativity, and critical thinking.

#### 2. Posters and props

Children will be introduced to the pond habitat and identify common animals that live there.	<b>Book:</b> "Over and Under the Pond" by Kate Messner <b>Discussion:</b> Animals that live above the pond (like ducks and herons) and under the pond (like frogs and fish). How the pond is a home for many creatures.	Sorting Pond Animals Children sort animal picture cards into two groups: "Lives in a Pond" and "Does Not Live in a Pond." Materials: Animal picture cards, two category headers.
Day 2	Frogs and Turtles Children will learn characteristics of frogs and turtles through movement and sensory experiences.	<b>Book:</b> "Turtle Splash! Countdown at the Pond" by Cathryn Falwell <b>Discussion:</b> What makes turtles splash into the water. Other pond animals like frogs and dragonflies. How turtles move on land and in water.	Move Like a Pond Animal Children move like different pond animals by copying motions such as hopping like a frog or flapping like a duck. Materials: Pond animal picture cards, open space.
Day 3	Ducks and Water Birds Children will identify duck features and understand how they live near and on the water.	<ul> <li>Book: "Just Ducks!" by Nicola Davies</li> <li>Discussion: What ducks do in and around water. How they swim, dive, and eat. Where ducks go when the seasons change.</li> </ul>	Duck, Duck, Goose Game Children sit in a circle and play the classic game using "duck" and "goose" or other pond animals like "frog" and "turtle." Materials: Open space for a large circle.
Day 4	Fish and Underwater Friends Children will explore underwater pond creatures and their movements.	<b>Book:</b> "Fish Eyes: A Book You Can Count On" by Lois Ehlert <b>Discussion:</b> Counting colorful fish. What fish look like—eyes, fins, tails. How fish swim and what it feels like underwater.	Magnetic Fish Letter Catch Game Children catch fish using magnetic rods, then name the letter and sound on each fish. Materials: Fish cutouts, magnets, fishing rods, blue felt or paper pond.
Day 5	Insects & Amphibians Children will review pond animals and introduce insects like dragonflies and amphibianslike newts.	<b>Book:</b> "In the Small, Small Pond" by Denise Fleming <b>Discussion:</b> Tiny pond animals like tadpoles, dragonflies, and frogs. How animals change as they grow. What lives in a pond throughout the seasons.	Pond Process Art Children paint a pond background, then add tissue paper flowers and crepe paper lily pads to create a pond scene. Materials: Blue/green paint, tissue paper, crepe paper, paintbrushes, glue, white cardstock.

### Day 1: Welcome to the Pond!

Children will be introduced to the pond habitat and identify common animals that live there.

#### Introduction

Ask, "What do you think lives in a pond?" Show a picture or poster of a pond and point out the water, plants, mud, and animals. Explain that a pond is a small body of still water where many animals live, swim, or rest nearby. Say, "Some animals stay above the water, and others live underneath it!" Ask, "Have you ever seen a pond before? What did you notice?"

### Song

"Five Green and Speckled Frogs"

**Props:** Log and Frogs (X5)

Actions: See Circle Time Props Section

### **Read Aloud & Discussion**

Book: "Over and Under the Pond" by Kate Messner

**Before Reading:** "What do you think a pond looks like? Have you ever seen one?" Explain that this book will show us the world above the pond, where birds and people can be, and below the pond, where animals live and hide.

After Reading: "What animals did we see above the pond? What about under the pond?" Talk about how some animals, like ducks and herons, stay on top, while others, like frogs and fish, live underneath. Ask children which animal was their favorite and where that animal lives in the pond.

### Activity

#### **Sorting Pond Animals**


**Materials:** Picture cards of various animals, two headers labeled: "Lives in a Pond" and "Does Not Live in a Pond"

Activity: Show the children a picture of an animal. Ask them to decide whether it belongs in the "Lives in a Pond" or "Does Not Live in a Pond" category. Encourage discussion by asking guiding questions like: "Have you seen this animal in water before?" "Does this animal swim or live near water?" "Where does this animal build its home?" Talk about why each animal fits into its category and help the children describe where the animal lives and what it might do there.

**Extension:** Turn the activity into a movement game by labeling one side of the room "Pond" and the other "Not a Pond." Show an animal card and have children move to the side that matches where the animal lives.

### Five Green and Speckled Frogs

Five green and speckled frogs Sat on a speckled log, Eating some most delicious bugs. Yum! Yum! One jumped into the pool, Where it was nice and cool. Now there are four green speckled frogs. Glub! Glub!

> Four green and speckled frogs... Three green and speckled frogs... Two green and speckled frogs... One green and speckled frog...



### **Circle Time Props**

Print, laminate and cut out. If using on a felt board, attach velcro to the back of each piece. If using on a white board, attach magnetic strips to the back of each piece.

Print multiple copies and attach to craft sticks for children to use (optional).

Actions:

- Five green and speckled frogs (Hold up 5 fingers and "hop" them like frogs)
- Sat on a speckled log (Sit fingers on "log" made with arm)
- Eating some most delicious bugs. Yum! Yum! (Pretend to catch and eat a bug rub tummy)
- One jumped into the pool (Make one finger hop into the "water")
- Where it was nice and cool (Fan face or wave arms like water)
- Then there were four green speckled frogs. (Hold up 4 fingers)
- Glub, glub! (Make bubble or swimming motions)
- Repeat with: 4... then 3... then 2... then 1...
- Last verse: Then there were no green speckled frogs.

(Hold hands out in a shrug — no fingers up)













### Duck

Ducks are birds that live near ponds, lakes, and streams. They have waterproof feathers and webbed feet to help them swim. Ducks float on water and dip their heads to find plants and bugs to eat. They build nests near the shore and lay eggs. Ducks can walk, swim, and fly. When they are on the water, they often stay with their families—baby ducks are called ducklings and follow their mother everywhere!
