Book: "Rainbow Fish" by Marcus Pfister Discussion: Why fish have fins, gills, and scales. How sharing can help us make friends. What fish need to live in water.	Watercolor Resist Fish Children draw with white crayon, then paint to reveal patterns. Materials: Fish template, white crayon, watercolor paints, brush, water, towel, googly eyes, glue, marker. glue, black marker.
Day 2	Octopuses Children will learn about the unique traits of an octopus, including its eight arms, suction cups, and ability to squirtink.	Book: "My Very Own Octopus" by Bernard Most Discussion: How octopuses use their arms to grab things and hide. Why they squirt ink. What makes octopuses clever ocean animals.	Beaded Octopus Craft Children cut and decorate an octopus with beaded pipe cleaner arms. Materials: Octopus template, googly eyes, glue, hole punch, 8 pipe cleaners, beads.
Day 3	Dolphins Children will recognize that dolphins are mammals, not fish, and explore how dolphins breathe, communicate, and live in groups.	Book: "If a Dolphin Were a Fish" by Loran Wlodarski Discussion: How dolphins are different from fish. Why they need air to breathe. What dolphins do in their pod to stay safe.	Ocean & Sand Sensory Bin Children explore sea animals in water and sand; sort or create habitats. Materials: Bin, play sand, blue water/beads, ocean animals, shells, scoops, cups, gems.
Day 4	Crabs Children will observe how crabs use their claws and move sideways, and describe how their hard shells help protect them from danger.	Book: "Clumsy Crab" by Ruth Galloway Discussion: How crabs move sideways and use claws. Why shells keep them safe. What helped the crab feel proud in the story.	Popsicle Stick Crab Craft Children build a crab with popsicle sticks, pipe cleaner legs, and beads. Materials: Crab template, red popsicle sticks, pipe cleaners, beads, googly eyes, glue, marker.
Day 5	Sharks Children will understand that sharks are fish with cartilage instead of bones and explore their important role in the ocean.	Book: "Smiley Shark" by Ruth Galloway Discussion: What sharks eat and how they help the ocean. Why not all sharks are scary. How Smiley Shark became a hero.	Shark Headband Craft Children color and wear a shark headband for songs or play. Materials: Headband template, crayons, scissors, tape/stapler, paperstrip.

Day 2: Octopuses

Children will learn about the unique traits of an octopus, including its eight arms, suction cups, and ability to squirt ink.

Introduction

Ask, "What do you know about octopuses?" Show a picture or model of an octopus and point to its long arms. Explain that an octopus has eight arms with suction cups and lives on the ocean floor, squeezing into small spaces to hide. If something tries to scare it, the octopus can squirt dark ink and quickly swim away. Say, "Octopuses are very clever. They can open jars and even change color to blend in with rocks." Ask, "Can you count to eight on your fingers and wiggle your arms like an octopus?"

Song

Ocean Animals" (Tune: "The Wheels on the Bus") Verses 1&3

Prop: Octopus

Actions: Verse1: Move both hands in a wavy motion like you're swimming around in a big circle.

Verse 3: Wiggle all fingers and move arms like wiggly octopus legs.




Read Aloud & Discussion

Book: "My Very Own Octopus" by Bernard Most

Before Reading: "Have you ever seen an octopus? What do you know about them?" Let children know this fun story is all about a child imagining what it would be like to have an octopus as a pet. We'll learn about its long arms, squirting ink, and clever hiding spots.

After Reading: "What silly things did the octopus do in the story? Where would you take your octopus friend?" Talk about how octopuses can change color and squeeze into small spaces. Ask, "What would you name your octopus if you had one?"



Activity

Beaded Pipe Cleaner Octopus Craft

Materials: Printed octopus and mouth templates, googly eyes, glue, hole punch, 8 colorful pipe cleaners, assorted plastic beads


Activity: Have each child cut out their printed octopus head from purple cardstock. Help them glue on two googly eyes and a small pink paper smile. Punch 8 holes along the flat bottom edge of the octopus head. Children will choose 8 pipe cleaners and thread one through each hole, folding it in half and twisting it once to make two arms. Invite them to slide beads onto each arm to decorate. When finished, help them bend the ends of the pipe cleaners to keep the beads in place.

Extension: Use the octopus craft for counting and patterning practice. Have children count the total number of arms or create color patterns with the beads. Display all octopuses on a class "Ocean Wall."
































Parts of a Crab






Dolphin


