Stormy Weather

Storms happen when big clouds fill the sky. We see rain, hear thunder, and watch lightning flash.

Rain: Rain falls from storm clouds and makes the ground wet.

Lightning: Lightning is a quick flash of light in the sky. It comes from a cloud and looks like a zigzag.

Thunder: Thunder is the loud sound we hear after lightning. It can be soft or very loud!

Play safe: If there's a storm, it's best to stay inside and watch the lightning.

Summer Weather

Day 1: Signs of Summer

Children will explore and identify signs of summer, such as hot temperatures, blooming flowers, and bright sunshine.

Introduction

Ask the children, "What happens when the seasons change from spring to summer?" Let them share their thoughts. Guide them toward ideas like longer days, warmer weather, and more flowers and insects. Discuss how summer brings changes in nature. Then ask, "What do you like to do when summer begins?" and encourage them to think of outdoor fun.

Song

"Summer Weather" (Tune: "The Wheels on the Bus")

Prop: Summer weather props (one or more)

Actions: Encourage children to sing along and act out the movements suggested in the Circle Time Props section.




Read Aloud & Discussion

Book: "Summer Days and Nights" by Wong Herbert Yee

Before Reading: "Have you ever been outside on the first warm day of summer? What did you see? In this story, a little girl explores her summer day and night and notices all kinds of summer things. Let's see what she discovers!"

After Reading: "She saw so many signs of summer! What were some of the things she did? (She saw insects, played outside, listened to birds, and cooled off with a fan.) What's your favorite thing to do in the summer?"



Activity

Summer Sensory Bin

Materials: Kinetic sand or dried corn (sand), blue water beads (water), mini beach toys (shovels, buckets, rake), small plastic seashells, toy sunglasses, mini flip-flops, sun cutouts, scoops, or tongs.

Activity: Fill a bin with kinetic sand or dried corn to represent the warm summer sand. Add blue water beads for water. Place summer-themed items like beach toys, shells, and sunglasses throughout the bin. Encourage children to dig, scoop, and explore with their hands or tongs. Talk about signs of summer, like sunny weather, going to the beach, and wearing hats and sunscreen.




Extension: Count how many seashells are in the bin!
